## **Harbor Interfaith Hosts “Transitions Through Art”**

### **An Event to Raise \$50,000 for Transitional Housing**

SAN PEDRO, CA: Harbor Interfaith Services, the South Bay’s lead agency of homeless services, will host an event, “Transitions Through Art”, on Saturday, September 30, 2017, from 1:00 to 5:00 p.m. The event will take place at the agency’s headquarters at 670 W. 9<sup>th</sup> St., San Pedro.

Transitions Through Art will raise \$50,000 for Harbor Interfaith’s 20-year-old transitional housing program, Accelerated Learning & Living. The program offers heads of households eighteen months of living in an apartment building while they pursue a degree or certificate to stabilize family finances.

The afternoon has an art theme. Works will be on display created by area artists as part of an auction to raise funds.
